We pray all those who are fighting Covid. For doctors, nurses and hospital staff. We those working long hours dressed in PPE. For those who are tired, and frightened they can take no more. For those who are ill,

and for their families, especially those who are unable to be with their loved ones. For all administering vaccinations – we give thanks for the work of science, and pray for the practicalities of distribution and immunization. For people needing treatment for other illnesses, those whose treatment is delay or cancelled all who are frightened and confused.

Maranatha, Come, Lord Jesus.

We remember those who have died. At this time of festival, we remember those special to us. We ask for faith, for your healing power, and for your love. Thank you for the journey we have been on together. Maranatha, Come, Lord Jesus.

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
