Prayers of Intercession, led by Mary Wallen

The thread running through the reading from Acts and the extract from John's gospel that Julie read for us this morning is quite simple. God's love, the Holy Spirit, is for everyone. We have been granted this great love so that we may love one another as much as God loves us. As we are told, this is greatest and most fundamental commandment of all. This is so enormous it could even be felt to be 'mind blowing'. It is made clear that this love is for everyone, not just for us, the privileged few within these walls today or in our warm and comfortable homes in the relatively safe suburb of Derby.

Christian Aid, as an organisation, bases their work on the premise that; 'Everyone is equal in the sight of God'. The aims of Christian Aid are: 'We stand together; for dignity; for equality; for justice. Working to create a world where everyone can live a full life free from poverty.'

I have been thinking, long and hard, about how I can show God's love in my daily life and I would like you to join me with this thinking in our prayers this morning. In particular thinking about the work of Christian Aid and how each one of us may be able to support their worldwide work.

After each section of the prayers I would like us to have a **short silence** for our own personal thoughts, followed by this response: I shall say "Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do." Your response will be **'Holy Spirit fill my heart today.'**

I ask that God will be with us all at this time of prayer, that we may think carefully and wisely and take something from our prayers that will bring us closer to fulfilling the commandment; 'Love one another as I have loved you'. Amen.

Firstly, thinking of the whole world. Lord, please enable help to reach the people of India, who are struggling so much with the COVID 19 pandemic. Their need for medical supplies and basic facilities is desperate, the suffering acute. How can we help them?

Lord, please enable peace to be agreed in those countries plagued by civil war; Myanmar, Israel and Palestine, Syria and a depressingly long list of others. Innocent people are being killed, they are living in appalling conditions and it must be almost impossible for them to feel any kind of hope for the future.

One in three people globally do not have access to safe drinking water. This is a staggering and shameful statistic. God's love is for all, including every one of these people suffering in so many ways. Maybe, we, personally, can help events in these distant countries by donating something to Christian Aid in the coming week.

Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do. Holy Spirit fill my heart today.

Now to think of our own country. Lord, we ask that our politicians, including those local politicians newly elected on Thursday, might have the integrity to act for the common good and that they will be guided by Christian principals and truly strive for a society where there is equality of opportunity for all. Lord, please help us all to work for the reduction of racial tension. Help everyone to think carefully about any judgemental behaviours and thoughts they may have so that love is given equally to all people. Think now, do I ever find myself making unfounded assumptions, giving people a 'label' for no real reason? Help me to see beyond the stereotypes that society has adopted and give love to all, as Jesus teaches us to do. We ask that the church might continue to spread the love of God and have meaning for people in the 21st century. How can this happen? What can we do to help?

Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do. Holy Spirit fill my heart today.

In our parish. Lord, please help those in positions of influence in our churches, St Edmund's Allestree and St Matthew's, Darley Abbey that they may lead us to respond to the Your commandments and guide us all so that more local people may come to know of Your great love for them.

Lord, we ask for your blessing, love and support for those who are sick, especially any known to us. We ask that your continued love is poured onto them. Lord, please show Your love for those who grieve, particularly those we miss so much.

Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do. Holy Spirit fill my heart today.

Next we pray for our own families. Lord, we think now of our own families, the young, the old and everyone in between. They all have very different needs and different problems. Let us bring them before You now. Help us to give Your love to all our family members. Lord we ask for Your guidance so that we may; support rather than judge, love rather than doubt, understand rather than dismiss. Help us to be driven by Your love in all our relationships.

Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do. Holy Spirit fill my heart today.

Lastly we pray for ourselves. Lord, help us to look inwards and evaluate our lives. Help us to listen to Your word and find ways of loving everyone; our family, our friends, people known to us and people in the wider world we have never met. What can each of us do? How can we show love? A smile (difficult when wearing a face covering!), a kind word, by giving unwanted goods to a charity shop, praying for peace, praying that people all over the world may have dignity, equality and justice, supporting those who work to achieve this aim.

Lord Jesus fill me with the Holy Spirit so I may have the strength to love everybody, as You have commanded me to do. Holy Spirit fill my heart today.

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
