God and Father of us all, in Christ you give us one Lord, one faith, one baptism: look in love upon the Church, the fellowship of the baptized, and renew her life in unity and peace.

We pray for the life of our churches, our Diocese and bishop, for vision as we move into 2021 - for the worldwide church, for Christians struggling so much more than we are. We those we baptize, for those whose baptisms have been delayed. For our own faith, our commitment, and our journey together.

In faith we pray:

We pray to you our God.

Your Christ has commanded us to go and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit: look in love upon the world, redeemed by his blood, and work out your purpose for the whole creation.

We pray for the political situation of our world. We offer to God the images we have seen from America. We pray for a peaceful transfer of power - for Donald Trump, Jo Biden - for senators and those who work in the Capitol. For our Prime Minister and his government, for those in the Civil Service. For our City Council and local government, for all trying to make rules, observe rules, and those who angry, frightened and confused.

In faith we pray: We pray to you our God.

As a mother brings her child to birth in pain and yet in joy, you bring us to new birth in the waters of baptism and make us your own by adoption and grace: look in your love upon each one of your children, and bless with your presence every house and every family.

In the silence, let's name our families and friends before God. Thinking of those we miss so much, those who are struggling

In faith we pray: We pray to you our God.

We have accepted the baptism with which Christ was baptized, your children suffer various trials, testing their faith, as they await the salvation of their souls: look in your love upon those who walk in deep darkness and those who suffer beyond endurance.

We know Lord we are in a time of deep darkness, and we pray for the Covid situation. For those who are fighting the virus, those who are so very ill, those who are caring for them, all our medical staff - under so much pressure. Our Hannah is spending today vaccinating people - so we give thanks for the miracle of science, and pray that this might help control and defeat the virus. We pray for our teachers and schools, for parents, for workers, for those who find themselves without work. Lord, help us to have faith, and

In faith we pray: We pray to you our God.

Christ is risen, the first-fruits of the harvest of the dead. In baptism we die with him in order that we may be alive with him: look in your love on all who are passing through the deep waters of death. May they walk in newness of life.

We pray for those whose earthly life will end this day - and we pray for those who can't be with their loved ones as they die. For St Edmund's we pray for George Aird whose funeral takes place this week - for Kathleen and the family.

In faith we pray: We pray to you our God.

Grant, Lord, that we who are baptized into the death of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ may continually put to death our evil desires and be buried with him; that through the grave and gate of death we may pass to our joyful resurrection; through his merits, who died and was buried and rose again for us, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
