Welcome to Choral Evensong as we celebrate our Bicentenary. This is a tiny fragment of something else; it is a part of the worship which is offered to God by Christian people every hour of the day and night, in every part of the world.

When you come to Choral Evensong it may feel as if you are doing nothing - as the choir do most of the work. In our world of action and involvement, this can seem very strange. But in a way you are dropping in on a conversation already in progress - a conversation between God and his people which began long before you were born and which will continue long after you are dead. For a brief moment, you step into the continual stream of worship which is being offered today and which will be offered to the end of time. You are one with those who worship here on earth and in heaven.

Evensong is drawn almost entirely from the Bible. Its primary purpose is to proclaim the wonderful works of God in history and in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Its secondary purpose is to evoke from the worshipper a response of praise, penitence, prayer, and obedience.

Much of the English of the service is the language spoken and written by our ancestors more than four hundred years ago - and used by the Evans and their workers two hundred years ago. It may sound old-fashioned but its meaning is not out of date.

The first reading - Ecclesiasticus 44.1-11

Let us now sing the praises of famous men, our ancestors in

they were intelligent; those who spoke in prophetic oracles;
